We give thanks to God as we both struggled and found strength to serve!



Typically received during the season of Lent, each gift to One Great Hour of Sharing supports efforts to relieve hunger through the Presbyterian Hunger Program, promote development through the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People, and assist in areas of disaster through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

- —\$4.1 million granted by PDA in the United States and 57 countries in the first half of 2020
- —94 grants impacting 20 countries
- —over 5,000 projects in economically poor communities in the United States and around the world have had an opportunity to develop solutions to their own challenges since SDOP's inception
