## Treasurer's Report

Dave Jones presented the financial report for YTD as of June 30, 2010.

- Total Plate offerings received = \$47,384
- Special Offerings and other gifts were \$3,646. Investment Income was \$4,765.
- Expenses were \$49,901.
- The Development Fund is \$178,179 and the Memorial Fund is \$5,160.
